






## Workshop on Legal Rights and the Impact of COVID-19 on Formerly Incarcerated Women and Girls

**AdvocAid** in partnership with **UN WOMEN** organized a day workshop for 18 newly released women and girls. The purpose of the workshop was to create a platform for these women to **share their stories on the COVID 19 pandemic impacts** on both newly and formerly released women to assess legal aid services, levels and trends of violence and current situation of **women in prisons**.



The UNWOMEN Program Specialist spoke to theme 16 of activism and encouraged the women to speak for their rights.

The formerly incarcerated women and girls developed advocacy messages to target key stakeholders on issues relating to their **legal rights**.

The formerly incarcerated women and girls took **photographs** with these messages displayed on placards and was shared on **social media**.

AdvocAid will catalogue these messages to develop **policy briefs and advocacy messages** targeting policy makers and key stakeholders for **law reform**.









## The **advocacy messages** the women developed are the following:

- 1. **SGBV** crime related cases could be investigated thoroughly.
- 2. Government should look into the **overcrowding** in prison and release **petty offence** cases.
- 3. The **arrest rights** of women and girls must be protected.
- 4. Police officers should stop asking female suspects for **money**.
- 5. Community and family members should stop **discrimination and stigmatization** among ex-prisoners.
- 6. The **justice system** should be fair to all and government should have **optional sentences** for minor crimes (e.g. community services, farming, skill training).
- 7. Government should listen and investigate complaints coming from the public towards the **police**.
- 8. **Decriminalized petty offences** like loans or debts to avoid overcrowding in prison.
- 9. The **family visitation** should be a priority and easy access.
- 10. Police officers should treat female suspects with **respect** in prisons.
- 11. Government should provide enough **food**, water and medical facilities for prisoners.
- 12. Women and girls under arrest have **right to legal representation**.
- 13. Not all cases should be charged to court (minor offences) and **minimize sentence** for women and girls who come in contact with the law.
- 14. Government should look into **petty offences** to be settled at police level and not at court level.
- 15. Stop **rape** against women and girls in detention.
- 16. Improve on **hygiene conditions** for women ang girls in detention.
- 17. Provide **child friendly services** in detention center.
